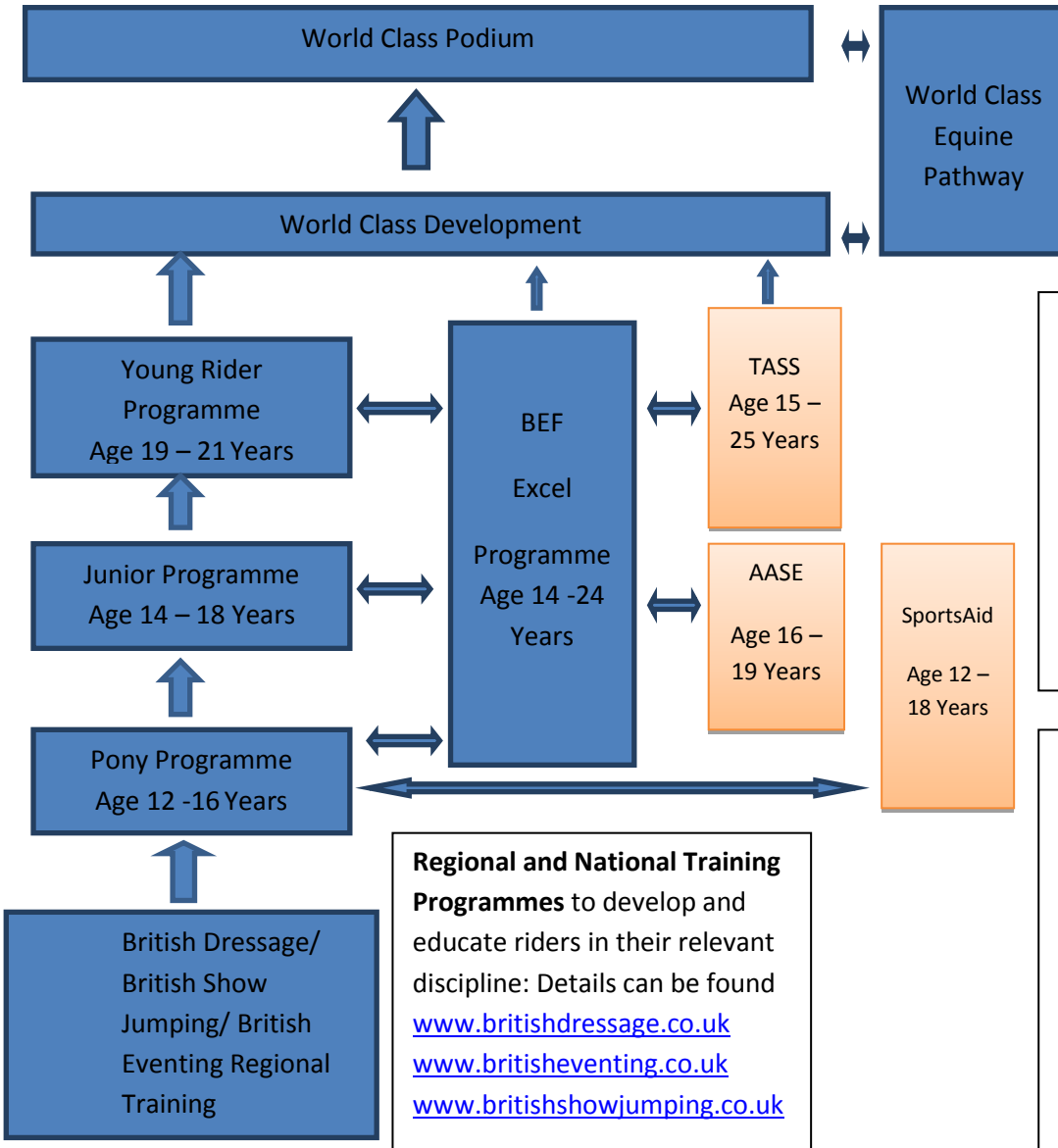


Equestrian Talent Pathway for the Olympic Disciplines



WORLD CLASS Programmes: The World Class Programme is based on a "no compromise approach" and has the sole aim of winning medals on the World stage. It exists to provide Britain's elite riders with the best preparation to represent Equestrian Team GBR at World, European, Olympic and Paralympic level in the four Olympic / Paralympic disciplines of Eventing, Dressage, Show Jumping and Para-Equestrian Dressage.
